Reset have supported over 20 students this half term from nearly all the local secondary and middle schools. This week we completed some work on knife crime, where students engaged really well and completed a very informative display

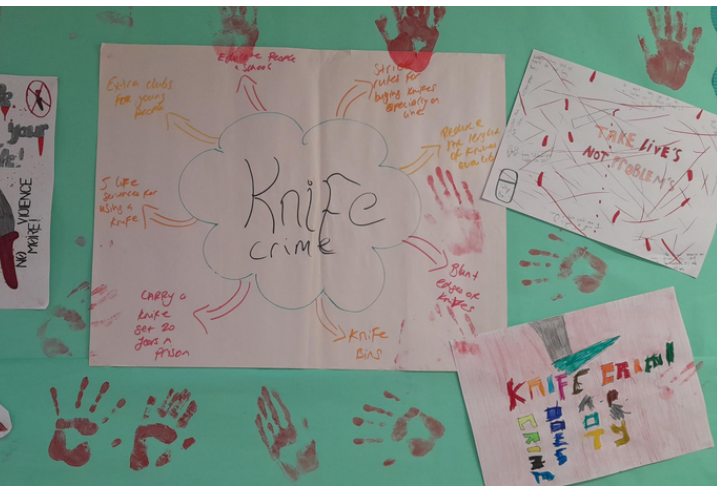

Since September we have supported 45 students, 31 of which have returned to mainstream school, the remaining have attended Moorbridge. Students attend 5 days a week and we differentiate students work to meet their needs and ability, focusing on building their confidence. Students have recently been looking at knife crime, to build in cultural capital we have looked at the story of Samantha Magin and the students have created posters around knife crime.

Oswin Terrace has welcomed a number of visitors this half term, who have worked with all our students in both KS3 and KS4.

The DWP have been in and worked with Y11s on skills for Post-16, including team work. Paul Hannaford gave a powerful talk to students about his life and the impact drugs, knives, gangs and prison has had on his life.

Anne and John from the charity Diversity Role Models delivered a session about helping end LGBTQ+ bullying and equality – they complimented Oswin students on their engagement and great questions during their visit.

The half term has ended with mock exams for Y11s, who have been excellent role models for the other Oswin students by turning up on time for their exams and trying their best in every exam, and behaving impeccably during the exam period

Art controlled assessments to start W/C 22/4/24
